Ray County Memorial Hospital hosted an after hours on October 22nd, 2015. There were tours offered of the new Renovations as well as tours of the hospital grounds.

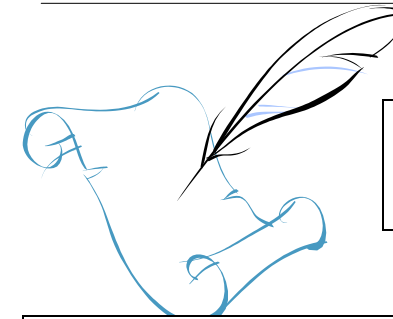
