The cost to support the Richmond Christmas Light Displays is substantial. Each year, the Chamber pays to have them hung and taken down, along with the cost to replace bulbs, Brackets, tape and numerous other expenses that coincide with the beautiful displays that are hung on the light poles around our community. Last year, in an effort to create funding for this endeavor, the Chamber hosted the 1st Annual Chamber Golf Classic-Christmas in September. The support from the local business community was astounding! Last year, we replaced all of the outlets that are used to power the displays. The ones that we had prior were very old and not weather proof. This year, as a result of your donations, we are going to be able to hang up an additional 12 displays and relocate 7 existing displays. Main Street and Wollard Blvd are the main focus of this years efforts. Last year, there was a noticeable gap in displays along these routes. Some of the funds from last years tournament were also used to help the Richmond Downtown District purchase a new Santa House for the Christmas Extravaganza as well as purchase decorations for the house. The Chamber has formed a committee to supervise the utilization of the funds created by the Annual Chamber Golf Classic.
