

Every business owner/professional knows how hard it is to get attention in this information overloaded society. Whether you're working as an independent contractor, starting a new business, or trying to build an established company, you've got the same challenge: How can you stand out from the pack so that potential customers realize how wonderful you are? Here are five tips that I think will help you stand out and grow your customer base.

- 1. Create content--newsletters, video, blog, free download, etc.--that others can use to share your expertise. The more content you generate, the more opportunities you nurture.
- 2. Develop a contact list--and keep adding to it. For example if you speak at a business event or have a booth at a conference set out a sheet of paper inviting people to sign up for your newsletter list. The exposure you get from speaking is nice and having a booth is nice, but it's a one-time event. The real opportunity is getting permission to stay in touch with people.
- 3. Be consistent. Send something out to your contact list the same day every week. Your customers or contacts may not read it every time, but when they need something you provide, you will be on the forefront of their mind.
- 4. When you advertise or do marketing, offer insights, not just information. Thanks to Google, there's no shortage of information. The hard part is making sense of it. So offer both perspectives and advice.
- 5. Be remarkable! Find the thing that's so interesting, or unusual, or creative about what you're doing that prospective clients are not only going to remember you--they'll tell their friends about you and your story. Then share it over and over.
